Dr. Khalid Bazaid is a fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in general psychiatry and in the subspecialty of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry. He is an active member of the Canadian Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (CACAP), the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry (AACAP), the American Psychiatric Association (APA), the Saudi Commission for Health Specialties, and a member and ex-secretary of the Saudi Psychiatric Association (SPA) since it was first established in 2005. Dr. Bazaid has served children and adolescents both in the outpatient and inpatient departments regarding major psychiatric disorders, including depressive disorders, anxiety disorders, psychotic disorders, bipolar disorders, obsessive compulsive disorder, attention deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), and autism spectrum disorders (ASD). He served on several scientific committees and social support groups on child abuse, ADHD, ASD and developmental disabilities. Dr. Bazaid is the founder and course director of the International Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Review Course that was held for the first time in April 2013 in Jeddah, Saudi Arabia. Dr. Bazaid is also the founder and course coordinator of the intensive Child and Adolescent Psychiatry – Hands-on Training Assessment and MSE, for two consecutive years, in November 2014/2015 at Al-Amal Mental Health Complex, Dammam, Saudi Arabia. Dr. Bazaid is also the founder and course director of the University of Ottawa Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Update Course for Primary Care, held for the first time in 2019. Dr. Bazaid's primary clinical and research interests include ADHD, ASD, developmental disabilities, and depressive disorders.
