



Giovanni de Girolamo is a Medical Doctor, Specialist in Psychiatry and Director of the Unit of Epidemiological and Evaluative Psychiatry at the IRCCS Fatebenefratelli in Brescia, of which in the years 2008-2013 he was Scientific Director. He is Professor at the Faculty of Psychology of the Catholic University of Milan, and lecturer at the UNIMIB School of Specialization in Psychiatry. He was Visiting Fellow at the Institute of Psychiatry in London, at the Institute of Psychiatric Demography in Aarhus (Denmark), and at the University of Pittsburgh (USA). From 1988 to 1994 he worked at the WHO Mental Health Division in Geneva as a Medical Officer, under the guidance of N. Sartorius.

From 1998 to 2001 he coordinated the National Mental Health Project at the Italian N.I.H., with more than 100 centers in Italy. He has directed numerous multicentre research projects, including the:
