Albert completed a successful and distinguished career in the UK National Health Service and at the UK Department of Health. He has worked in various clinical settings, research and policy development in mental health and public health for over 40 years. He was acclaimed as one of the top 40 people of Asian origin to have influenced the development and shaping of the NHS; <u>Nurturing the Nation: The Asian Contribution to the NHS since 1948.</u> He was awarded Honorary Life Membership (Fellow) by the General Assembly of the World Psychiatric Association and he was given the Seva Award for "Service to WACP and Contributions to Cultural Psychiatry" by the World Association of Cultural Psychiatry (WACP). Albert serves on several scientific committees and boards, including those of WACP, WHO and the European Co-operation in the field of Scientific and Technical Research Committee. Over the past five years he has led on developing a discipline of psychiatry called <u>Geopsychiatry</u>, with a primary focus of <u>"putting mental health into foreign policy"</u>. He has published and co-authored numerous scientific papers and texts. He will co-edit a textbook on Geopolitical Determinants of Health in 2022 and another on Geopsychiatry due for publication in 2023.
