The objectives of this program are to increase interest and exposure to psychiatry for medical students early in their careers, and identify strong candidates in psychiatry who may wish to come to Ottawa for residency training. The Department of Psychiatry hosted 13 students from the University of Ottawa for one week of morning lectures at the Royal Hospital and afternoon observerships at different sites. Students were exposed to psychiatrists from various disciplines and backgrounds who have won national awards from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, become Deans of Medicine, written national bestseller books, and even given TED talks, as well as many more accomplishments. Students did observerships in the community, consult liaison, child psychiatry, forensics, inpatient, mood and anxiety, schizophrenia, and perinatal psychiatry, which gave them a more in-depth experience in the different subspecialties.
