Dr. Gustavo Bezerra, psychiatrist and psychotherapist; Supervisor of the Psychotherapy Service at the Institute of Psychiatry, Hospital das Clínicas, Faculty of Medicine, University of São Paulo (IPq-HCFMUSP); Group therapist and a psychotherapy teacher at the Faculty of Medicine. As a psychotherapy teacher, Dr. Bezerra lectures to third- and fifth-year medical students and also works as a psychotherapy supervisor in the psychiatry residency program. Dr. Bezerra states: "We have a large and well-structured Psychotherapy Service at our psychiatric hospital, which brings together different therapeutic approaches . . . In our medical school psychiatric rotation, we ask students to create a subjective work reflecting on their experience during the rotation, and they often develop artworks . . . Since attending the Art and Psychiatry symposium as part of the WPA Congress in Mexico, 2024, I started using *ekphrasis* in medical psychology classes last year (2024) and it was a success, so we're expanding it this year (2025)."
