

## WPA ECP SECTION ACTION PLAN 2025-2028

### 1- Introduction:

The Section of Early Career Psychiatrists (ECPs) under the World Psychiatric Association (WPA) represents a dynamic and diverse group of early-career professionals dedicated to advancing global mental health care. Recognising the challenges and opportunities faced by ECPs, the section has served as a crucial platform for professional growth, collaboration, and innovation. With a strong foundation of zonal representation, an active network, and a history of engaging sessions and initiatives, the ECP Section is well-positioned to enhance its impact.

This action plan addresses identified gaps and strengthens the section's organisational structure, visibility, and member engagement. It establishes clear objectives and key actionable steps to enhance the quality of ECP activities, streamline membership processes, foster meaningful collaborations, and expand the section's outreach on both national and international levels. By implementing these measures, the ECP Section aims to empower its members, facilitate impactful contributions, and ensure sustained excellence in psychiatric practice worldwide. It outlines a strategic roadmap from 2025 to 2028 to transform these aspirations into measurable and impactful outcomes.

This action plan aligns with global mental health priorities, including the World Health Organisation's Mental Health Action Plan 2013–2030, which urges the strengthening of mental health services, the promotion of human rights, and the empowerment of service users and professionals. It is also in accordance with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Goal 3: Good Health and Well-being, which includes targets for the promotion of mental health and well-being across the lifespan. In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, the global mental health landscape has undergone a profound transformation. The crisis emphasises the urgent need for scalable, accessible, and equitable mental health services. This evolving context has amplified the relevance of digital psychiatry, tele-mental health solutions, and an equity-focused approach, particularly for underserved populations.

By anchoring our activities in these global frameworks, the WPA ECP Section reaffirms its commitment to making a significant contribution to the advancement of mental health care worldwide.
